Geodesy? What's That? Oct 22 2022 Geodesy (the measurement of the size and shape of the earth), fascinating since the time of Eratosthenes, became a basic science for the space program. Irene Fischer was a leader in the construction of the World Geodetic System (has an Earth reference ellipsoid named in her honor) when it was still being done by surveyors, piecing together terrestrial, gravitational and astronomical data. By the 1970s, satellite geodesy and marine geodesy were just coming into their own. Using her career, Fischer revels in explaining how the science unfolded, and how misunderstandings occur across scientific fields, e.g., why the "standard ocean" and the geoid do not easily translate across the fields of oceanography and geodesy. Her account should appeal to those writing the history of women in science. Government science, too, is less well studied than academic science even though some fields, such as geodesy, were always government led. Fischer provides food for thought, as well, to those who claim to study the management of science in bureaucratic settings different from those of industry or academia. Peppered among these themes are Fischer's solutions to historical mysteries such as why Columbus' used a figure for the size of the earth's circumference that was so much smaller than Eratosthenes' or Posidonius' (with the added benefit of making it easier to persuade his patrons).

Historical Dictionary of Sweden Sep 09 2021 For centuries Sweden was a rather backward, relatively unknown country. It burst onto the world scene during the Viking Age, and then under the warrior kings Gustavus Adolphus and Charles XII in the 17th and 18th centuries, only to withdraw into isolation again. In this century, however, the country has been transformed and hailed as a model welfare state. The over 240 entries in this volume range from the Viking Age to the present day, but the emphasis is on personalities and events of the 20th century and Sweden's rapid social and economic evolution. Sweden's internal affairs are reflected in articles on economics, politicians and political parties, newspapers, parliament, trade unions, social welfare, education, religion, and the status of women. Foreign affairs are covered in such articles as Sweden and Finland, Union with Norway, Estonia, Nordic Council, the two World Wars, Neutrality, the United Nations, and the European Union. Cultural entries include Swedish theater, music, visual arts, literature and language, libraries, and cinema. Several Swedes of international fame have been included (e.g., Linneaus, Kreuger, Nobel, Palme, St. Birgitta, and Raoul Wallenberg). The dictionary is preceded by a chronology and an introduction which give the reader an overview of Swedish history. There is, finally, a substantial bibliography to assist further reading.

Conscientisation and the Journey to Self-advocacy Feb 26 2023 This study critiques the deficit model of examining disengagement from secondary schools and the terminology of at-risk associated with early departure from school. Using the theoretical framework of Freirian critical analysis and the praxis of conscientisation, the research in this paper suggests that youth experiencing marginalization can participate in critical reflection and student empowerment. The model of self-advocacy and collaboration developed in this study explores resilience and autonomy as a precursor to a student's re-engagement in learning communities and more inclusive involvement in what I call a synergistic model of democratic education. Interviews were conducted with grade nine and ten students from an alternative secondary school who had chosen re-engagement despite various experiences of marginalization. In an effort to appropriate a more authentic exploration of the students' existing knowledge of themselves as learners, their Ontario School Records were used as a primary resource for the students to deconstruct their own academic, social and cultural histories. The voice of these students is examined through the lens of narrative inquiry within a contemporary participative action research framework. The critical dialogue that ensued became a scaffold where the students could negotiate individual and social changes (Freire, 1999; Ecclestone, 2004; Dei, 2003), face some moments of disequilibrium (Mikesch McKenzie, 2003) in their school stories, and become more competent as problem-solvers and contributors in the conversation about the difference between schooling and getting an education.
